Your Neighbourhood Policing Team (NPT) plays a vital role in tackling many of the local issues that matter to you. They are out in your area every day, and always available to offer crime prevention advice or for you to raise concerns with.

Each NPT consists of a dedicated Sergeant, Police Constable (PCs) and Police Community Support Officers (PCSOs) all under the command of an inspector. While they may be the ones you see the most, the NPTs do not work alone. They are supported by staff and officers from across the whole Humberside Police force area, and they work closely with local authorities, community leaders and residents to decide the local policing priorities for the area and find useful, long-term solutions.

Our approach is shaped by four key themes: We protect vulnerable people and keep people safe; We are out in your communities, visible, listening and working with you to deliver the services you need; We successfully tackle crime and ASB; We will be there when you need us.

*Here's a summary of **just some** of the crimes that have been reported across all three Wards last month:*

Residential Burglary reports

7/1/26 Thornwick Avenue, residential burglary to property, persons known, and enquiries continue to establish circumstances.

16/1/26 West Ella Road, residential burglary to property while occupants on holiday, entry forced via a rear door, once inside conduct an untidy search exiting as per entry. Enquiries ongoing to establish circumstances.

23/1/26 Kingston Road, residential burglary to property that is currently under renovation, kitchen window has been smashed to gain entry and tools stolen from within. Enquiries ongoing.

Humber-talking has set our priorities; this month we are to:

- **ASB – Mercure Hotel and surrounding retail park**

The hotel has become a target for ASB over recent weeks which involves numerous youths attending and running throughout the hotel and on a couple of occasions cause damage. Throughout February patrols will continue to show high visibility in hotspot areas. We will also look to work with Wolfreton School as most of the offenders are from the school.

- **Theft offences**

Retail theft and burglary will remain a high priority over February. This is due to both offences spiking over the festive period. Police surgeries will be held in stores to help deter crime and engage with the public and allow shop staff to speak to officers.

- **Road Safety**

Last year road safety was a beat priority, and several Pro Laser deployments were carried out. Throughout February we will continue to monitor speeding throughout the Kingston and Willerby Road area and utilise social media to provide warnings and reminders of the dangers and consequences of drink driving.

[Report Fraud](#) is now live and will now become the national reporting centre for cybercrime and fraud, replacing *Action Fraud*.

Cybercrime and fraud are now the most common crime in the UK, accounting for around 50 per cent of all offences and costing the economy billions of pounds each year.

Report Fraud has been created to meet this challenge by providing a single, national gateway for reporting and intelligence that will strengthen the collective response of policing, government and the private sector.

It brings together the reporting of both cybercrime and fraud in one place for the first time, making it quicker, clearer and more supportive for people and businesses to come forward.
