Meet the team-

Your Neighbourhood Policing Team (NPT) plays a vital role in tackling many of the local issues that matter to you. They are out in your area every day, and always available to offer crime prevention advice or for you to raise concerns with.

Each NPT consists of a dedicated Sergeant, Police Constable (PCs) and Police Community Support Officers (PCSOs) all under the command of an inspector. While they may be the ones you see the most, the NPTs do not work alone. They are supported by staff and officers from across the whole Humberside Police force area, and they work closely with local authorities, community leaders and residents to decide the local policing priorities for the area and find useful, long-term solutions.

Our approach is shaped by four key themes: We protect vulnerable people and keep people safe; We are out in your communities, visible, listening and working with you to deliver the services you need; We successfully tackle crime and ASB; We will be there when you need us.

Crimes of note

Residential Burglary reports

4/2/25 Burdon Close, unknown suspects approach victim's detached garage and attempt to lift open the roller door. Suspects manage to lift the door a small amount which causes an alarm to trigger causing suspects to flee the area.

5/2/25 The Lawns, attempt burglary to property after victim sees a figure stood on bench in rear garden with negative results in gaining entry.

13/2/25 Scarrington Crescent, residential burglary to garage, nothing stolen from within.

14/2/25 Westborough Way, attempt residential burglary to garage with negative results but causing damage in the process.

19/2/25 Hawthorne Avenue, entry gained to property by smashing rear patio doors, stealing items from within before exiting as per entry. Enquiries still ongoing.

25/2/25 Springfield Way, suspects have smashed front window to gain entry conducting an untidy search within before exiting as per entry. Enquiries ongoing.

Business burglary reports

5/2/25 Tranby Ride, three unknown suspects have entered a secure site and attempted to gain access to a container which stores plant machinery with negative results.

Thefts

3/2/25 Sainsbury's, shop theft after known male walks into the store and picks up a basket, filling it with high value goods before walking out of the shop without offering payment. Enquiries ongoing.

5/2/25 Morrisons, shop theft, male known and enquiries ongoing.

7/2/25 Waitrose, shop theft, suspect named and enquiries ongoing.

10/52/25 Kingston Road, one adult male arrested and charged for theft of vehicle from property. Enquiries ongoing.

16/2/25 B&M, Willerby Shopping Park, one adult male charged and arrested for shop theft

Damage

26/2/25 Bernadette Avenue, unknown male has thrown a brick through the front downstairs window causing both panes to smash. Male is later arrested and enquiries ongoing.

Drugs

16/2/25 Willerby Square, one adult male charged and arrested for possession of drugs. Enquiries ongoing.

Community Priorities March 2025

1. Tackling Vehicle crime

This period is always one of our busiest, however, we would like to offer reassurance to residents and a stark reminder to those intent of causing harm or committing offences, that we are out in force and ready to act against anyone involved in vehicle crime.

Action - aims to:

- reduce vehicle related crime.
- raise awareness within the local community about vehicle security.
- provide crime prevention advice to community members.

- reduce the number of recorded crimes related to Theft from Motor Vehicles (TFMV)
- enhance security measures to protect the registered keeper.

2. Preventing Residential dwelling Burglaries.

During the winter months, it is usual for us to see crimes such as burglary and theft rise, particularly if houses and vehicles are unattended.

Burglars are often opportunistic thieves who prey on houses, garages, sheds and outbuildings. They seek out any opening that they can take advantage of, specifically doors and windows that are left open or unlocked or are easy to force.

Crime Prevention Advice

Burglary is not just about lost belongings, it's a violation of safety and security that can have lasting emotional consequences for victims. National statistics show that 41% of burglaries are opportunistic, which often succeed due to inadequate security measures. This includes unsecured entry points, insufficient lighting, and a lack of awareness surrounding basic prevention principles.

On average around 12 burglaries are reported in the Humberside region per day, with a seasonal rise in February each year, particularly shed burglaries.

Distraction burglary

Distraction burglars pretend to be someone they are not to gain entry to your home. There are a few things you can do to prevent distraction burglary. Don't be afraid to ask questions about anyone at your door – genuine callers won't mind. Always remember if in doubt, keep them out.

- Use your door viewer to see who's there.
- If you open the door, put the chain on first.
- Always ask for ID and check it with the company, call the customer service department. Close the door while you do this.
- If you feel at all unsure, schedule a time for the caller to come back when a friend or relative is there.
- For pre-planned appointments with utility companies, a password scheme can be set up.
- Finally, if you feel threatened or in danger by the presence of the caller, call 999.

Here are five tips to help you keep your home and belongings stay safe while your away:

- If your off on holiday and wish to post anything on social media, make sure your posts aren't public and that they're only seen by friends.
- Leave lights and a radio timer on to make the property appear occupied.
- Get a trusted neighbour to keep an eye on your property or join a Neighbourhood resident Watch Scheme.
- Consider asking your neighbours to close curtains after dark and to park on your drive.
- Remember to cancel newspaper and milk deliveries.

ANYONE CAN BE ABUSED... Domestic abuse is a serious and widespread problem although it is often hidden. It happens in all kinds of relationships, regardless of race, class, religion, cultures, age, sexuality, disability, or gender.



Domestic Violence and Abuse Partnership (DVAP) Operational Team (East Riding)

Professional and public referrals (calling about your own situation) can be made by calling 01482 396368. DVAP work in a consent-based way. They will explain their privacy policy and that information will only be shared with your consent. The exception to this rule would be if there was reason to suspect that children were at risk or was an immediate risk of a serious criminal offence being committed in which case, they are duty bound to share information but will discuss this with you first.
