We're pleased to share updates from across the parish and highlight some of the great work happening in our community.

CHRISTMAS EVENTS

Last year's Christmas event was a great success, and we received wonderful feedback from stallholders, entertainers, and those who attended.

Springhead School held a competition to design the event poster and the Christmas card distributed to homes in the lead-up to the event. The standard of entries was extremely high, and we thank all the pupils who took part.

This year's event will take place at **4pm on Friday 4th December**. Once again, we are very

grateful to St Mark's Church for the use of both the church and church hall. More details will be shared closer to the time, but we're delighted to confirm that the reindeer, singers, and dancers will be returning. FESTIVE LIGHTING

We have replaced a significant number of ageing Christmas lights and now have a refreshed and varied display across the parish.

We are also pleased to announce a joint project with Kirk Ella & West Ella Parish Council to install festive lighting and decorations on the Haltemprice roundabout.

This collaborative project will be in place for the 2026 festive season and will also allow us to mark other important occasions throughout the year.



DOG POO BAG DISPENSERS

We have installed several dog waste bag dispensers across the parish, which are regularly refilled by councillors.

Unfortunately, some individuals are taking excessive quantities.

If this misuse continues, we may have to remove the dispensers.

If you have suggestions on how to prevent this, we would be very happy to hear them.



PARKING CONCERNS

We have all seen an increase in illegal and dangerous parking on double yellow lines and footpaths. This has led to pedestrians being forced into the road and, in some cases, vehicles driving on footpaths.

To address this, we have secured additional support from East Riding Civil Enforcement Officers. We encourage residents to report dangerous parking via the "parking issue" section on the East Riding of Yorkshire Council website.

POLICING UPDATE

We are pleased to welcome our new Neighbourhood Beat Officer, PC David Towers, who joins PCSOs Sophie Leng and Barbara Danby.

PC Towers brings 21 years of frontline policing experience, including response, roads policing, and neighbourhood roles. His initial priorities include tackling anti-social behaviour over the summer, addressing retail crime at local shopping parks, and dealing with the illegal use of electric bikes and scooters. If you witness misuse of electric bikes or scooters, please report it via 101, including any identifying details.



ENVIRONMENT & GREEN SPACES

We have continued planting trees across the parish to enhance the local environment and welcome suggestions for future planting locations.

This work has been supported by individuals on the Community Payback Scheme, who have also helped cut back overgrown verges and will continue this work in the coming months.

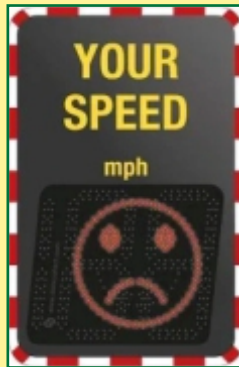
Each year, parish councillors plant daffodils, which brighten our verges during March and April. We're delighted that this continues to be appreciated by residents.

We would also like to thank the Friends of Anlaby House Grounds for their fantastic voluntary work. They have planted flowers, managed vegetation, improved pathways, and increased the number of bird boxes (materials provided by the parish council). Further improvements are planned, and we are very grateful for their ongoing efforts.



SPEED INDICATOR DEVICE (SID)

In response to residents' concerns about speeding, we have purchased a Speed Indicator Device (SID), which will soon be installed around the parish. It will be moved periodically to different locations to help raise awareness and encourage safer driving.



The device will also collect general data on traffic speeds, which may help us secure additional enforcement support where needed.

Residents can also use Operation Snap through Humberside Police to report dangerous driving if they have dashcam or video evidence.

COMMUNITY EFFORTS

We would like to thank local residents who volunteer with A.L.P.s (Anlaby Litter Pickers) to help keep our parish clean. If you would like to get involved, we can provide tabards, gloves, litter pickers, and bags—your support would be very welcome, please contact the Parish Clerk if you are interested.
